Hopefully you have made your hotel reservations by now. The University Guest House has given us special rates for our gathering. There are still some rooms available, you may call the hotel at 801-587-1000 or toll free at 1-800-416-4075.

Gathering Registration: 3-6:00 p.m. Wednesday, Oct.4, Conference Level Lobby

Conference registration will be held just inside the conference center located in the lower portion of the hotel at the west end of the building. There is an outside entrance for the conference center from the hotel parking lot which is in the rear of the building. The opening ceremony begins at 7:00 p.m. in the Douglas Ballroom.

Weather

Salt Lake City is beautiful this time of year! The average daytime temperature ranges from the high 60's to low 70's. Nighttime temperature is typically in the mid 40-degree range. The weather is changeable this time of year so be prepared for sun, rain or even an early snow.

Transportation to/from The University Guest House and Conference Center

TRAX

Trax is Salt Lake City's light rail system. It takes about an hour to ride from the airport to the Fort Douglas stop, which is just west of the University Guest House.

The fare is \$2.50 one way for an adult ticket and \$1.25 for seniors. Take the GREEN Line located at the south end of airport terminal one, to the Courthouse station. Exit at the Courthouse station and take the RED line (across the platform) designated to the University Medical Center. Exit at the Fort Douglas stop. Take the stairs or the ramp down to ground level. From there you can walk to the parking lot of the Student Life Center, just north of the stairs and call the hotel shuttle for pick up. (Bell desk number 801-587-0629) Or, you may take the stairs or the elevator across the overhead bridge, walk east until you come to a cross street, turn left, walk past the chapel and you'll see the sign for the University Guest House Hotel. Just a note, there is little room for luggage on TRAX. You may find an empty seat but there are no luggage racks available.

LYFT

LYFT ride is approximately \$16.35, Lyft Plus approximately \$23.94. The ride is about 23 minutes.

EXPRESS SHUTTLE

The first passenger fare is \$15.00, each additional passenger for the same ride is \$8.00. You must make a reservation for this service at least 16 hours in advance. You will need to provide the airline, flight number, and city of origin for your reservation. The driver will accept cash or checks or you can pay online with a credit card. Discounts are available for groups but you

must go through an Express Shuttle representative. You may call 1-800-596-1600 or register online at expressshuttleutah.com.

Meals

A generous breakfast with fresh fruit and hot entrees is provided for participants registered at the hotel. There is no actual restaurant in the hotel, so we will be catering meals that Crones Counsel will provide during the event. We will serve appetizers at the Meet and Greet on Wednesday evening. The 25th year Jubilee Banquet meal will be provided on Thursday evening and a salad bar for Saturday lunch will be provided.

All other meals are “on your own”. **Heritage Dining Hall** is on campus and within a short walking distance from the hotel. The meals at **Heritage Hall are delicious**, usually cost between \$9-10.00, and offer Vegan and many other healthy choices.

There are multiple restaurants located nearby. A list of accessible restaurants will be provided in the Welcome Packet. The hotel shuttle will be available for transportation to local restaurants.
